



Poster Competition on Save Environment Say No To Plastic






Centenary Celebration Department of Sociology University of Mumbai

Field Work at Gorai Beach

In order to relate Text with context and to enhance the understanding of the students about the subject the students visited Gorai beach to facilitate their understanding about problems faced by the local communities at Gorai-Manori Creek due to government's plan to develop Special Economic Zone in the area.

Team of Second year B.A students interacted with the local fisher folks of the area and interviewed them to gain an in-depth knowledge on the subject with the help of case study and interviews.







VISIT TO OLD AGE HOME 12TH JAN 2019















A group of 46 students comprising of 35 females and 11 male students visited Khidmat Old Age Home to extend learning beyond syllabus possible for the students. They had assembled at the college by 7:00am. The bus left for Uttan at 7:30am.

The old age home was about 3 & half hour distance, as soon as we reached a briefing of the topic was done by Prof. Mariyah Gour, Head Dept of Sociology who guided all the student how to conduct Interview.

The person in charge of the old age home received the volunteers at the gate, gave them instructions and asked them not to click any photographs, took them to different floors where all the old males and females were staying.

Soon after the entry to Old Age Home the students registered themselves. The shawls which were donated by Ms. Aateqa Qureshi and Ms. Sumaiya Qureshi, our ex-students of 2014-15 batch was gifted to old persons residing in the home.

All the men were on the ground floor while the women were on first floor. There rooms were made and each room was shared by two inmates. And those who were not in a condition to move were on the second floor were extra care was given to them

In a couple of minutes, some students started distributing shawls to them while others were engaged in conversation with the residents of the old age home. While having a talk with one nurse over there students came to know that people residing there had to pay for staying so it was not a complete charitable trust.

As they entered the room they saw two old men were resting and when they saw us they welcomed us and offer to seat. We sat and started talking to them. One of them was a music composer and composed many music of 60's. He also sung his composed songs. He was Eager to share his experiences of life with us and another was church priest. Most of them while sharing their experience sometimes got excited and sometimes emotional. They also shared photographed of their young days and their family with us. They also shared some stories about young days.

Proceeding further they took interview of inmates on the other floor that is old women's floors. One of the old women caught our student as she thought her to resemble her daughter and started weeping. Some of them were disabled too. They all were so happy to see us and they all were gave us blessings.

They complete day was divided into five parts morning they use to get students asked few question to which she answered "we are not allow to tell all this" but later she answered up by 7am then have their bed tea , later they have their fruits and do their prayers. During noon they are again gathered for lunch by 1 am, they get a proper complete diet which is designed by a nutritionist. Watch TV after that then by 5 they have tea and dinner by 8 pm. This was all what nurse told to students. Students were in the old age home for for up to 2 hours. While leaving teachers donated a sum of 4500 Rs to khidmat and took a photograph together.

15th Jan 2019

On January 15th seven students from SYBA (Taha, Sameer, Saif, Aadil, Mehjabin, Juveriya, Mariyam) participated in Akshara's Gender Equality training workshop at Portuguese Church at 10am. The training began at 11:00 am followed by breakfast.



An introductory session was held to acquaint one with the concept of Gender Equality and Gender Sensitivity. Later 4 Games were introduced which helped in understanding the concept of gender equality more clearly.
