Total 57 entries were received online and as per the decision of the judges following photos were selected.





#### Report

### A Homage to Kamla Bhasin

Renowned Feminist, poet, author and a pioneer of the women's rights movement in South Asia

on Monday 4<sup>th</sup> October, 2021 at 11.00am

A Joint session was organized on Monday 4<sup>th</sup> October 2021, by Dept. of Sociology, Rizvi College of ASC in collaboration with Bhavan's H. Somani and Wilson College to remember and honor a Social reformer, poet, voice of women rights in India and South Asia 'The Midnight Generation', Kamla Bhasin.

An introductory video on her life and work was played for the students to make team acquainted with her activism for emancipation and empowerment of women. She is universally described as an unflagging feminist and one of the most original voices to have emerged in the course of the women's movement in the 1970s, who had the ability to rip through ideas of patriarchy with rapier sharp wit or laughter.

Her song and poems sung across boundaries that divided her verses were adrenalin shots for women. Bhasin wanted to reform the gender biased and crude system and these morals found it way in her poems. Her poem were unique not because it showed lyrical excellence but because it is connected to us. Three of her well known poems, Rewriting Nursury Rhymes, Kyuki Mai Ladki Hun Mujhe padhna hai and Baharon Ka Aana Nahin Rok Sakte were played for the students followed by discussion by Dr. Manjushah, Dr. Mariyah and Prof. Muneera.

It helped in developing critical evaluation of the racism and sexism in these rhymes to reflect how it is part and parcel of the social system and hence undeniable. It reflects the deep rooted PATRIARCHY in our society. Most of us ignore the fact and continue the cycle, Bhasin was that one person who has rewritten the nursery rhymes for us.





Though the rituals of society can restrain a widow from simple attainments of life but can't stop her from her innate desires. It make us feel that we could indeed break all the conventions and normative shackles that held us back from our journeys as women.


Boundaries were meaningless to Kamla Bhasin. Her life and work is full of zeal and clear reflection of pluralistic ethos of Indian society and civilization. One of Kamla's biggest passions was the idea of creating peace and harmony in South Asia, She worked relentlessly towards peace between India and Pakistan. Across countries and movements, activists felt that she was one of them. Wherever she went, she made an impact. Her spirit was what one would first connect with. Her laughter, her Buland awaaz, her singing, her slogans, her poetry, her style of communication mesmerized many.




to her, a person who shined and left her imprint where ever she stopped. Sadly the flaring lost her life battling cancer on 25th September.





















# Online PPT Competition on Cultural Landscape of Maharastra-Sept 2021





























## DDLJ at Maratha Mandir







































#### TRIP TO AAREY FOREST

## 22<sup>nd</sup> February, 2022

## Goregaon, Mumbai.

A field trip to Aarey Forest was organised by the Department of sociology, Rizvi college of Arts Science and Commerce on 22<sup>nd</sup> February 2022 for the students of SYBA. A group of 30 students had joined for the trip along with Dr. Mariyah and Prof. Shahida.

At 8am in morning the students gathered near Goregaon East ticket counter and took a BEST Bus for Aarey colony, it is locally available and very convenient. Our first stop was at Adani where the Metro Car shed was to be built originally. We observe the affected area and spoke to the locals to understand the severity of the issue. Next halt was at the location of Aarey hospital where after the breakfast a field work was conducted with the locals residing in the forest vicinity. Despite falling in the jurisdiction of Aarey colony is in the Mumbai Metropolitan Region the tribal still face problems like power cut, shortage of water, no sanitation, no school, etc. after the interview we moved ahead found a Balwadi runs by the NGO, where the kids aged between 2 to 6 years were involved in fun related learning. The students spent time at balwadi and clicked pictures and played with the kids and distributed the chocolates and other eatables with them.

Later we moved ahead for a little enjoyment at Chota Kashmir for enjoying the view of nature through boat ride and other fun adventure activities. The students ended their day with good memories and learning and a little bonding with our classmates and teachers.
