
























# Guest lecture on "ETHNIC CONFLICT AND CIVIL SOCIETY- INDIA AND BEYOND"



















# Excursion to Elephanta Caves Saturday, 22<sup>nd</sup> October 2022






People with special needs are those who are physically or mentally disable. Disability is any condition that more difficult for a person to do certain activity or effectively interact with the world around them.

The present research is an outcome of the field work conducted at Ali Yavar Jung National Institute of Hearing Speech and Hearing Disability, Bandra West, Mumbai. The topics covered ranged from Cerebral Palsy, hearing Impairment to mental illness. A background pilot study was conducted with the help of the Director and the staff. The data is collected through primary source whereby in-depth interview and case studies were conducted with children and their parents. It aims to describe the problems face by family and parents of children with special need in general and the children in specific.




















## PLASTIC RECYCLOTHON



Department of Sociology and Department of BBI organized a drive on "PLASTIC FOR RECYCLING" to save environment and an awareness drive for collection of plastic waste recycling in January-February 2023.



The program was held on Thursday, 19<sup>th</sup> January 2023, in the quadrangle of Rizvi college of Arts, Science and Commerce, at 10:30 am. We the class of TYBA has showcased our creativity in the making of best out of plastic waste. We decided to use plastic in every object to make it creative and to attract other students to come forward and donate plastic. It was a competition as well for those who made best out of plastic waste. Our models were judged on the basis of creativity, utilization of resources,

artistic composition and design, eco-friendly rating, utility of the product and overall rating.



Chlorinated plastic can release harmful chemicals into the surrounding soil, which can then seep into groundwater sources, and also the ecosystem. This can cause a range of potentially harmful effects on the species that drink the water. Keeping all these issues in mind, our mentor PROF. DR. MARIYAH GOUR came with this idea to make models out plastic bottles. We were getting marks of our project so we had to take part in the awareness program and we donated plastic bottles as well. The event began with an introductory session on the objective of the drive gratified by the presence of principal sir, along with everyone looking through the artistic things made out of plastic waste and selfie point. The drive was attended by 100+ students and awareness drive was in entire atmosphere.



All these models were purely made using waste plastic bottles. The class of TYBA made some dustbins, jars, house model, lamp, plants, and few other models. For dustbin they used bisleri bottles and donated some dustbins to other classes and one in the staff

room for teachers. For house model one of our classmates, used bigger bottles of plastic and waste paper. Likewise, other models were made of different kind of plastic bottles.

He got appreciation from principal and vice principal as well and was awarded for such huge donation.


## Fieldwork at Padgha
